Christmas GIFT GUIDE FOR TEACHERS

Ideas that are cost-effective, easy to distribute, and fun for kids.

Candy Cane Bundle:

Tie 2-3 <u>candy canes</u>, or other festive treats, with ribbon and a gift tag, like these <u>free printables</u>.

Mini Notebooks or Journals:

Buy in bulk and customise the cover with each student's name using festive stickers. Amazon sell these cute Christmas notepads!

DIY Hot Choccie Kit:

Fill a small clear bag with hot chocolate mix, marshmallows, and tie it with a bow. You could <u>make it look like a reindeer</u> for extra effect!

Festive Pens or Pencils:

Give each child a <u>pen</u> and/or <u>pencil</u>, or <u>fun rubber</u>, then bundle together with a gift tag that says "Write your own holiday story!" Here's some <u>blank</u> <u>gift tags</u> you could customise.

Christmas Bookmarks:

Print and laminate <u>Christmas-themed bookmarks like these</u>, or some black and white colouring ones, like <u>these</u>.

Mini Colouring Book and Crayons:

Bubbles or Small Toys:

Look for multi-packs of <u>bubbles</u> or <u>scratch pads</u> for example, then tie with a ribbon and gift tag like the ones suggested above.
