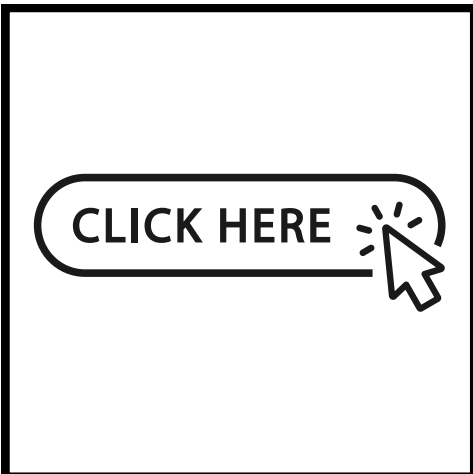


SAFE VS. UNSAFE

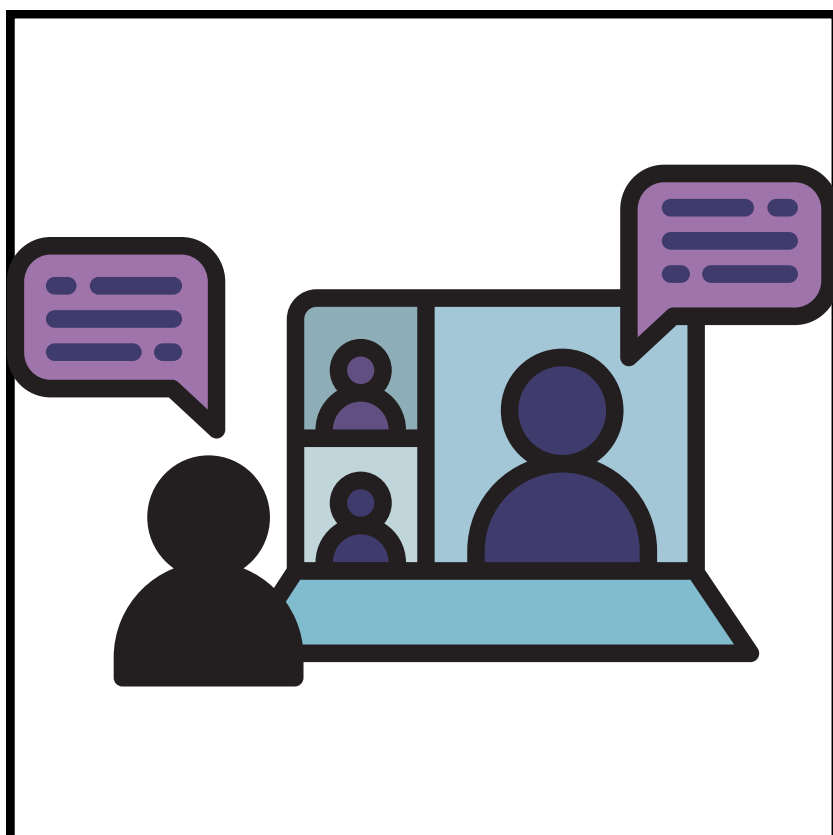
Colour in the background:

HOW TO USE THIS RESOURCE:

This resource is designed for discussion with Key Stage 1. Give each child a worksheet, on page 1, and a red and green colouring pen/pencil.

Go through each picture, one-by-one, and hold them up or, if you prefer, display on a screen.

Read out the sentence and ask them to colour the rest of the square in green if it's a good thing to do online, and stay safe, or red if it's an unsafe, bad choice to make online. You could role-play the scenarios too.

The pictures and sentences could also be used in a display for safer internet use, with the question asking, which of these scenarios are safe choices online and which are unsafe? If you wanted to take it one step further, these could be a 'lift the flap' display, revealing the answer of 'safe' or 'unsafe' underneath each sentence.
